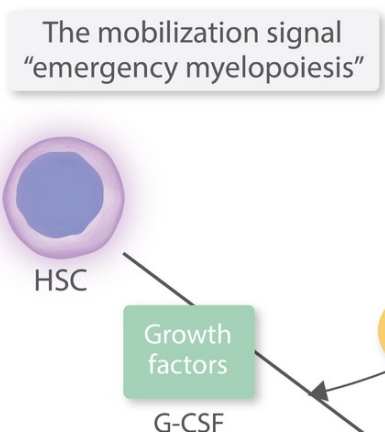
As part of the Topics-in-Focus on immunotherapy, a special issue with CAR T articles is published this month. Read the first contribution below.
